A 4-H Honor Club is a club that makes a special effort throughout the club year to tell the 4-H story to its members, families, and community. Obtaining the status of Honor Club may require each member to give a little more, go beyond the best, and make it better.

There is no limit on the number of clubs that may be recognized at each Honor Club level. The Honor Club system is offered as a challenge to individual clubs. This is a challenge within a club for members to work together to achieve a goal, rather than a contest between individuals or between clubs.

Four levels of Honor clubs are awarded depending on the total points earned by a club.

Platinum Honor Club	591 or more points – Club receives \$50.00 cash
Gold Honor Club	520-590 points – Club receives \$40.00 cash
Silver Honor Club	420-519 points – Club receives \$30.00 cash
Bronze Honor Club	370-419 points – Club receives \$ 20.00 cash
