

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# 4-H Project Judging Appointments

## Judging Info

You will be scheduling judging times through Signup Genius for Livestock Interview judging. More information and link to come. Scheduling instructions are included with this newsletter.

**Livestock Interview Judging** is August 14 from 1-5pm at the Wyandot County Fairgrounds Jr. Fair Arena.

### Scheduling will open soon!

*You need to sign up for EACH project you are taking. Example if you are taking two beef projects (#117M and #117BF) you need to sign up for two time slots back to back. If you are taking three beef projects (#117M, #117BF and #117DF) you need to sign up three time slots back to back. If you are taking Market Rabbit (#226) and Breeding Rabbit (#225) that is 2 projects so you need two time slots back to back. The judge needs time to talk to you about each of your projects.*

Makeup judging will be Wednesday, August 11 by appointment only through the Extension Office. Deadline to schedule makeup judging is Monday, August 2nd so we can schedule judges.

\*\*\*If you can't make the scheduled judging time or the make-up judging time you will need to contact the Extension Office. Your project judging will be conducted by a judging committee not your own club advisor and you will receive a participation ribbon.

**All livestock interview judging must be completed by August 20.**

Members who have not completed judging by the required date will be considered a member NOT in good standing and will be ineligible to participate in the Jr. Fair.



### **Dear 4-H Exhibitor and Parents:**

The Wyandot County 4-H Advisory Council with the generous support of Kalmbach Feeds presents to you the 2021 Kalmbach Feeds Wyandot County 4-H Skillathon Competition. The event will be held at the Wyandot County Fairgrounds Dining Hall on August 14, 2021 from 1:00 pm to 5:00 pm. It will be held separate from the Livestock Interview Judging.

We are encouraging Livestock exhibitors to be a part of an exciting and self-driven competition that will test an individual's knowledge of specific subject matter using the experiential learning model of exploring, reflecting and applying that knowledge. Using materials directly or modified from the *Learning Laboratory Kits*, as well as activities developed from information provided in and adapted from the Livestock Project Books, Ohio 4-H Animal Resource Handbooks. Skillathons are created to challenge the exhibitor's knowledge of all aspects of each respective animal species. Each Skillathon is comprised of four educational and challenging activities stations. Most participants will realize that the competition will judge their all-around knowledge of the animal and care outside the show ring. The county website has very good links to help prepare for the event in addition to the above listed areas.

Why participate? The skillathon competition is not a new concept however the competition in Wyandot County is. The premier sponsor, Kalmbach Feeds agrees with the philosophy of good animal stewardship and teaching today's youth of the opportunities and benefits of animal science in agricultural is vital to the success of this vital industry. They have dedicated themselves to the success of the 4-H program and competition by offering Cash Awards.

There will be two age divisions- Senior age 14 to 18, Junior age 8 to 13.

1<sup>st</sup> place in each age division and species \$75.00

2<sup>nd</sup> place in each age division and species \$50.00

3<sup>rd</sup> place in each age division and species \$25.00

## 4-H Cultural Immersion Project – Puerto Rico

Tuesday, November 23 – Wednesday, December 1, 2021 – Castañer, Puerto Rico

The best way to understand a different culture is to immerse yourself in it. Apply to be part of the Cultural Immersion project experience in Puerto Rico. You will build multicultural skills and understanding, as well as an increased ability to communicate in the increasingly diverse society that we live in. You will experience both the Old San Juan urban area as well as life in the remote mountain town of Castañer. We will also be working with 4-H youth from Puerto Rico in joint service projects.

Teens ages 15-19 (as of date of trip) are eligible for this 8-day service-learning experience. The cost of the experience is \$500 plus airfare (est. \$600). Limited scholarship funds are also available.
